

Come take an enchanting
“walk in the forest” at
MacMillan Bloedel Place.

In the VanDusen Botanical Display Garden, the pathway leading to the waterfall takes you to the entrance of this unique permanent exhibition about nature and especially about the nature of British Columbia forests.

MacMillan Bloedel Place is filled with exciting exhibits that invite you to become involved in the wonderland of botany, biology and ecology. You can sense the cathedral-like stillness of an old forest or the destructive impact of a forest fire. You can go inside a tree to see how it grows, or “turn on the sun” to see the process of photosynthesis. The exhibits combine words, illustrations, sounds and actions, providing many things to do, hear and sense. *July 11, 1970*

You will find MacMillan Bloedel Place set into an embankment in a forest glade in the northwest corner of the VanDusen Garden, itself a jewel among the many famous parks operated by the Vancouver Board of Parks.
